On the first of Nov: last I received your kind letter & present of Curious from Dr. Massy It was a large quantity & very fine for which accept my hearty thanks as well as for your kind endeavours for my interest -

The longer your letters are so much the more are they acceptable and if you knew how pleasing to me the smallest of your Natural informations from a Country so remote & unacquainted you would gratify me more at large, for my own part I shall always endeavour to encouage to relate in anything I can think agreeable to you M<sup>r</sup> Collinson has very fortunately had a Correspondent in Pennsylvania a poor Man but indefatigable in the love & pursuit of Plants and all other natural things - M<sup>r</sup> Collinson has procured from Dr Peters & two or three somewhat annual to enable him the better to prosecute his labours in collecting and sending Seeds &c. This poor Man has given his deserving the encouragement given him by his sending over a nice Collection of Seeds Specimens &c many of them new ones very Curious, particularly those he collected some hundreds of miles up at the Sources of the great River Schuylkill where he found Woods of an ever green tree the leaves not unlike our common Laurel producing bunches of very beautifull flowers, but the fruit not then being ripe he could not then taste it Prove it - It grows also from the Specimen (a copy of which I shall send you) in addition to our ever greens not a little curiosities I have removed my Garden from Hoxton to Fulham where the Soil being exceeding good I have in some measure re-created my Loss susteyned in the stony Soil at Hoxton and have a prospect of a collection of American hardy Plants excelled by none I shall send you a Catalogue of them in due time And if it be practicable & acceptable to send you a Case of some be particular in your commands
